"Klingon is a small, obscure language and it's a shame it's not spoken more," Frombgen wrote in her email while explaining

why the administration chose this language to add.

Klingon, for those who don't know, is the official language of an alien race in the

Thiel College Archivist and

Former Director of Admissions, John Hauser, said, "Hodge Hall has served us well since it was first opened in 1958.

It's too bad that it is being torn down, but we have to level the playing field for those students who haven't been able to experience the

luxury accommodations that it provides. Luxury accommodations are bad for student morale."

Thiel administrators had planned on placing incoming first year students into Harter Hall --

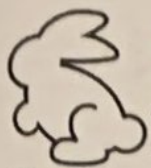

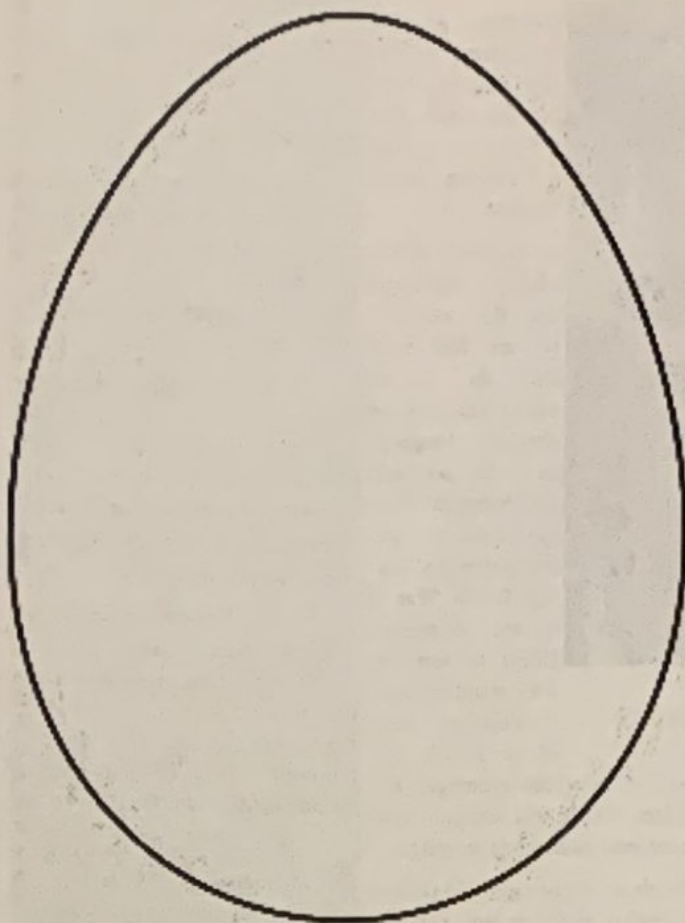

President Susan Traverso announced through email that since the recent rise in tuition Thiel has decided to give the students what they wanted. No, it's not to lower tuition.

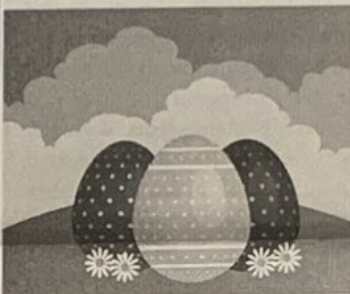
"It is something better... an Easter Egg hunt!" Traverso said in the email.

The students want to encourage everyone to really think about all the benefits that this price increase will have on Thiel. The students believe that this will have a greater impact on the Thiel family.

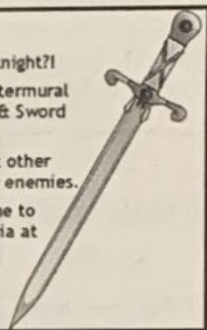
"...this could possibly lead to bigger donations from Thiel Alumni...that support student projects or to focus on other parts of campus," Anonymous.

Because of this, the choir has decided to do a show of just Marylin Manson songs while dressed in full drag on April 10 in Passavant at 8pm.

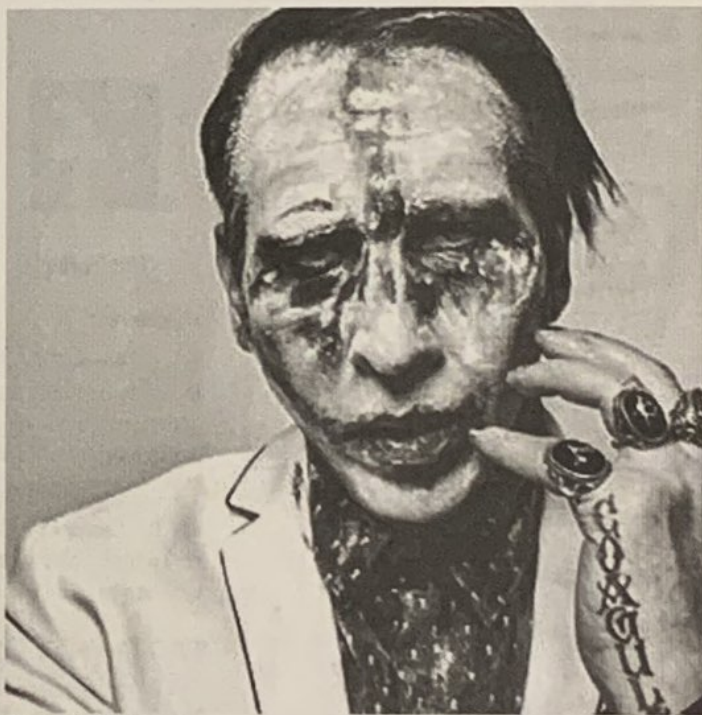

Klingon has a small but loyal group of speakers. Okrand's "Klingon Dictionary" has sold more than 300,000 copies, however Okrent says less than 1,000 people can read and write it. Even less are fluent in it, perhaps even only a few dozen.

"Although Klingon has only 3,000 words and a very small speakership, it is still far more usefully than Biblical Hebrew, which we also have a class on," Frombgen said in her email.

FBI Special Agent Fox Mulder has gone on record for the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette that he wants to believe that Klingon is the future of intelligence. He went to describe Klingon as having unlimited potential for undercover agents.

"Knowing Klingon would allow those who know it to speak privately in public in any country on the planet," Mulder said to journalist Ford Prefect.

With so little people knowing Klingon currently Mulder doesn't think its practical right now. He has been talking to colleges around the area looking for one to teach it to possible future agents. With colleges teaching Klingon he thinks it could become a favorite of law enforcement agencies around the country.

From what Frombgen said, Thiel College is the first to take Mulder up on this "super language." She thinks that Thiel being on the forefront could bring countless opportunities to the college. In her email Frombgen said these opportunities

including, putting their Criminal Justice Studies major on the map and making the college a recruiting station for the C.I.A.

In Prefect's article Mulder explained that this wouldn't be the first time that the United States has used an obscure language as code. He said that bilingual Navajo speakers specially recruited during World War II by the US Marine Corps to serve in their standard communications units of the Pacific. Be-

cause of this both Frombgen and Mulder believe that Klingon could be the next code talker language.

The class will be taught in tandem by Professors Sheila Nowinski and Michael Dorn. Nowinski will talk about the history of code talking and its effectiveness in intelligence gathering and war communication. Dorn will teach the language itself and was hired specially for this class.

"The class won't count toward a student's language requirement but will be open to all majors. It is, however, a requirement for all Criminal Justice Majors graduating in 2021 or later," Frombgen said in her March 14 email to the campus.

She ended her email with the traditional Klingon farewell, "Qapla'!"

Thiel College Explores Space With New Major
