



Drunk Man Throws Chair Off Balcony, Almost Hits Police Officers

April 11th, 2024: Country music star Morgan Wallen found himself in hot water once again after an incident involving him tossing a chair off a rooftop, leading to felony charges. The incident, which occurred in Nashville, Tennessee, has raised eyebrows and concerns among fans and the music industry alike.

The 31-year-old singer, known for hits like "Whiskey Glasses" and "7 Summers," allegedly threw a chair off the roof of a downtown Nashville building during a late-night gathering with friends. Witnesses reported the incident to authorities, leading to Wallen's arrest on the scene.

The Nashville Police Department confirmed the incident in a statement, detailing that Wallen was charged with felony vandalism for the reckless act.

The thrown chair reportedly caused

damage to property and posed a significant risk to public safety.

This isn't the first time Wallen has made headlines for his behavior. In February 2021, the artist faced backlash after a video surfaced showing him using a racial slur. The incident led to his removal from rotation on several radio stations and his suspension from his record label, Big Loud Records.

However, despite the controversy, Wallen's album sales and streaming numbers surged, indicating a loyal fan base. News of Wallen's latest run-in with the law has sparked mixed reactions among fans and industry insiders. While some expressed disappointment and concern for the singer's well-being, others criticized his actions, calling for accountability.

Wallen has yet to publicly comment on the incident or the charges against him.

However, his legal team released a brief

April Solar Eclipse Awakens Many Conspiracy Theorists

April 14th, 2024: Many conspiracy theories have been brought to light leading up to the recent solar eclipse back on Monday, April 8th.

For years many theorists have been

claiming the "end times" are upon us. These claims are rooted in political conspiracies, referencing the biblical rapture and some apocalyptic signs.

One major conspiracy that has been circulating is that the eclipse would mark the

start of a "massive human sacrifice event." A Reddit user wrote about this fear, citing maps that show the path of the eclipse totality, locations of major companies such as Tesla, and...

...fault lines related to the totality paths. They say that the path of the 2017 eclipse and the path of the one that just happened to create an X along the New Madrid Fault Line. They say that if an earthquake were to happen along that fault line it could create a seismic event that would be “up to 20 times larger than an earthquake with a SoCal epicenter.”

They bring up the topic of Elon Musk and the child’s mother, claiming they predicted COVID-19 and incidents related to the eclipse. A quote pulled directly from the Reddit post states:

“Speaking of X, Elon Musk changes Twitter's name to X. His baby's mother, Grimes, posted a strange image on Instagram before covid that literally told us covid was going to happen, all the way down to the 3 injections. In that same image, a few rows beneath the covid "prediction" is a solar eclipse. Under it, a flower between two dragons. 2024 is the year of the dragon. The lotus flower begins blooming in China on April 8th. The eclipse is happening on April 8th.”

Scientists, however, have said the paths of the solar eclipse lines and the fault lines have nothing to do with

each other, and while the possibility of a mass casualty event actually occurring is not impossible, it is highly improbable.

The Reddit user also mentions the “Deagel Projection” which claims that we could see a population decrease of 77.1% by the year 2025. Many reports have rejected this claim and shown that it is more likely that we will see an increase in population over the course of this year.

Other conspiracies regarding the solar eclipse have said the April 8th eclipse pass over between six to eight towns which collectively are called Ninevah.

It is brought to be a connection to a town referenced in the bible with the same name. This is proven incorrect due to the path only going through two towns with the name, and only possibly being close to the other four to six.

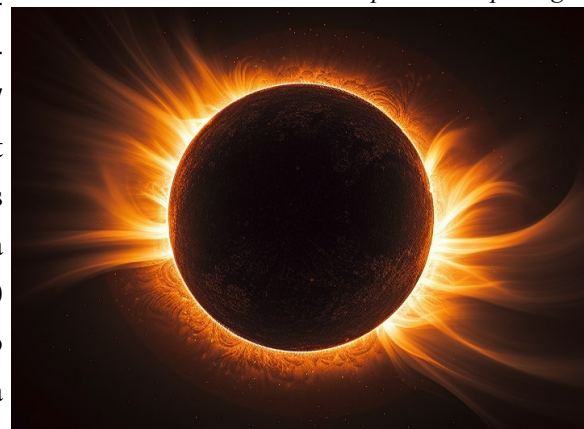
Another “abnormality” that people are focusing on is a crossover location that the recent eclipse totality path has with the path 2017 eclipse. The two paths intersect near St. Louis, which it is claimed has never happened in a TikTok video that has over 10 million views. The video also speculates giants waking up in a

nearby park. The paths crossing is not weird, actually, it's expected. Due to totality paths previously recorded and predicted for the future moving on a curved arc across the planet, they are bound to intersect.

There is also a claim that there would be a collapse of power grids and communication systems along the path of totality both leading up to the eclipse and following it. This type of event happening is possible, but only in certain locations. This type of event brings many visitors to many locations, some of which cannot handle the influx of people in the location. This number of visitors can put strain on an electrical grid and cell towers.

For many, the eclipse was a day to admire a natural occurrence, however, for others, it was a day of theories and religious prophecies.

Stranded Sailors Rescued Because Of Big Help

April 8th, 2024: A group of stranded sailors were rescued from a small, uninhabited island in the Micronesian Archipelago after constructing a "HELP" sign out of palm tree leaves.

What was supposed to be an Easter cruise on the Pacific Ocean turned into a precarious situation as three men, who were all related, left for Polowat Atoll on March 31. They rode the waves in a 20-foot skiff — a flat-bottomed variety of boating vessels — with an onboard motor. Six days later, on April 6, a woman reported that her three uncles had yet to return, and the U.S. Navy and Coast Guard launched a joint search effort, scouring a search area of more than 78,000 square nautical miles.

Eight days after the men had gone missing on Sunday, April 7, a U.S.

Navy P-8 Poseidon aircraft spotted a crude sign made of palm tree leaves that spelled out "HELP." The aircraft dropped survival packages to aid the men and a radio for communication. Using the radio, the men said they were fine, with access to some food and water, but their skiff had sustained damage.

Immediately the Coast Guard dispatched in search for the men, who were found on Pikelot Atoll, located over 100 nautical miles northwest of Polowat.

"A crucial factor in their discovery," said Lt. Chelsea Garcia, the search and rescue mission coordinator. "This act of ingenuity was pivotal in guiding rescue efforts directly to their location."

The trio were reported to have sufficient boating experience, but unsafe

conditions resulted in damage to the vessel, resulting in them having to go ashore to safety.

"Their initial goal was to fish around Pikelot, but the skiff was damaged when they approached the island due to the swells surging on the island and surrounding shoal," emailed Sara Muir, the U.S. Coast Guard's public affairs officer in Guam.

"Every life saved, and every mariner returned home is a testament to the enduring partnership and mutual respect that characterizes our relationship, making a profound impact on the lives of individuals and the resilience of communities across the (Federated States of Micronesia)," said Lt. Cmdr. Christine Igisomar, another search and rescue mission coordinator.

Mother Kills Self, Boyfriend, Daughter Before Eclipse

April 8th, 2024: Three people were found in separate locations in Los Angeles County. The bodies were identified as Danielle Cherakiyah Johnson, her boyfriend Jaelen Chaney, and her 8-month-old daughter.

Jaelen Chaney was found stabbed to death in his Woodland Hills apartment. Investigators believe Cherakiyah Johnson murdered Chaney around 3:40 a.m. before driving off with her two daughters. It is then

believed that Cherakiyah Johnson forced her two daughters out of the car on the 405 Freeway in Westchester. LAPD Lt. Guy Golan described the event as...

...“The suspect slowed the vehicle and opened the passenger door for her daughter and told her to get out of the car, when the daughter didn't do that, she forcibly pushed her out of the vehicle in the middle of the freeway while moving.” Cherakiyah Johnson's nine-year-old daughter was holding her baby sister when they hit the roadway. The hold on the baby was lost during the ejection and she was struck by a vehicle and pronounced dead at the scene.

Cherakiyah Johnson concluded her drive by sending herself and her car into a tree at speeds over 100 mph, killing herself in Redondo Beach.

Cherakiyah Johnson was known as an astrology media influencer on the internet. Days leading up to the

events, Cherakiyah Johnson posted to X, “WAKE UP WAKE UP THE APOCALYPSE IS HERE. EVERYONE WHO HAS EARS LISTEN. YOUR TIME TO CHOOSE WHAT YOU BELIEVE IS NOW.”

Hours before the murders, Cherakiyah Johnson then posted “ALERT: THIS IS THE FINAL WARNING. TURN NOTIFICATIONS ON. DO NOT LOOK AT THE ECLIPSE. SOMETHING BIG IS COMING.”

On the 8th, neighbors said they heard loud arguing in the middle of the night when Chaney was stabbed. Their next-door neighbor describes a bloody scene: “Their door was wide open, there was blood on the floor leading into their apartment, and then a trail of it in the hallway leading up to the elevator, and I saw

some blood on the walls.”

The same neighbor's father then called 911. He explained “Called the police and told them that something was not right,” he recalled. “And they told me, when I spoke to the EMT, to go in and check on the body. So I did. And he was deceased, he was facedown on the floor. And there was a lot of blood.” Unfortunately, the body of Chaney was not found until 7:30 a.m. after all the deaths unfolded.

The nine-year-old was transported to the hospital and is in the custody of the Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services. Sources tell that she is a witness to the Woodland Hills apartment homicide.

O.J. Simpson Dead at 76

April 10th, 2024: Football star, actor, and the man who was acquitted of murder; Orenthal James Simpson died from cancer last week on April 10th, at 76 years old. Simpson announced in May of 2023 that he had

been diagnosed with cancer but did not state what type nor how bad it was. Simpson also revealed he had been having chemo treatments and that “It looks like I beat it.” Orenthal James Simpson was born on July 9th, 1947, in San Francisco Califor-

nia. Simpson grew up playing football and attended college at the University of Southern California where he was a star running back. Simpson was drafted first overall by the Buffalo Bills...

...in the 1969 NFL Draft. He played 11 seasons with the Bills, rushing for 11,236 yards and 61 touchdowns. Simpson also was the first NFL player to rush for over 2,000 yards in a single season and the only player to do so in a 14-game season. Achieving this feat gained him the 1973 NFL Most Valuable Player Award. At the end of his career, he was traded to the San Francisco 49ers where he played 2 seasons before retiring from the NFL.

After the NFL, O.J. began acting, which he had experience in from acting in commercials throughout his football career. Simpson continued to act in commercials as well as guest starring on TV shows. Simpson acted in 17 movies throughout his acting career.

In 1994, O.J.'s ex-wife Nicole Brown, and friend Ron Goldman, were found dead at her home in Los Angeles California. O.J. was named as a top suspect in the murders and was arrested shortly after. Simpson

was arrested after he led an infamous police chase in his white Ford Bronco. The O.J. Simpson trial was known as the trial of the century and had almost 24/7 coverage. Simpson's team of defense attorneys was comprised of F. Lee Bailey, Robert Blasier, Shawn Chapman Holley, Robert Shapiro, Alan Dershowitz, and Robert Kardashian. This team of attorneys defended O.J. in court and got him acquitted. They created the well-known phrase "If the glove does not fit, you must acquit", referring to the O.J. trying on the gloves found at the scene of the murders.

After O.J. was acquitted, he moved from California to Florida to start on a fresh page. Florida also was a state where debts and seizures were not commonly collected by other states, such as a judgment owed by O.J. from his 1997 wrongful death civil trial. The suit was filed by the families of Ron Goldman and Nicole Brown.

In 2007, O.J. once again found himself in legal trouble, this time for

robbery. O.J. was charged with robbery of a hotel room in Las Vegas. O.J. was convicted and sentenced to 33 years in prison (2041), and eligible for bail in 2017. O.J. was let out on bail in 2017 at the age of 70 years old. Since then O.J. held a social media platform where he would comment on current issues, and sports, and post videos of him playing golf. On April 11th, O.J.'s Family posted this message on his X page; "On April 10th, our father, Orenthal James Simpson, succumbed to his battle with cancer. He was surrounded by his children and grandchildren. During this time of transition, his family asks that you please respect their wishes for privacy and grace."
